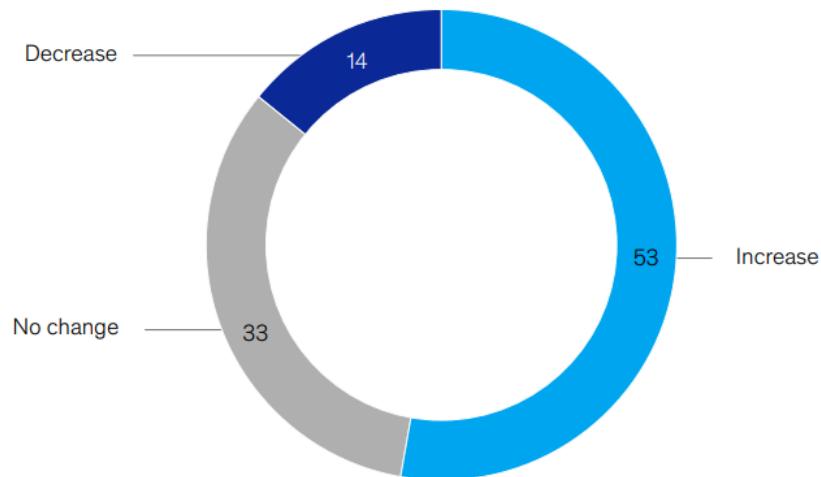
### Organizational benefits of hiring remote global talent

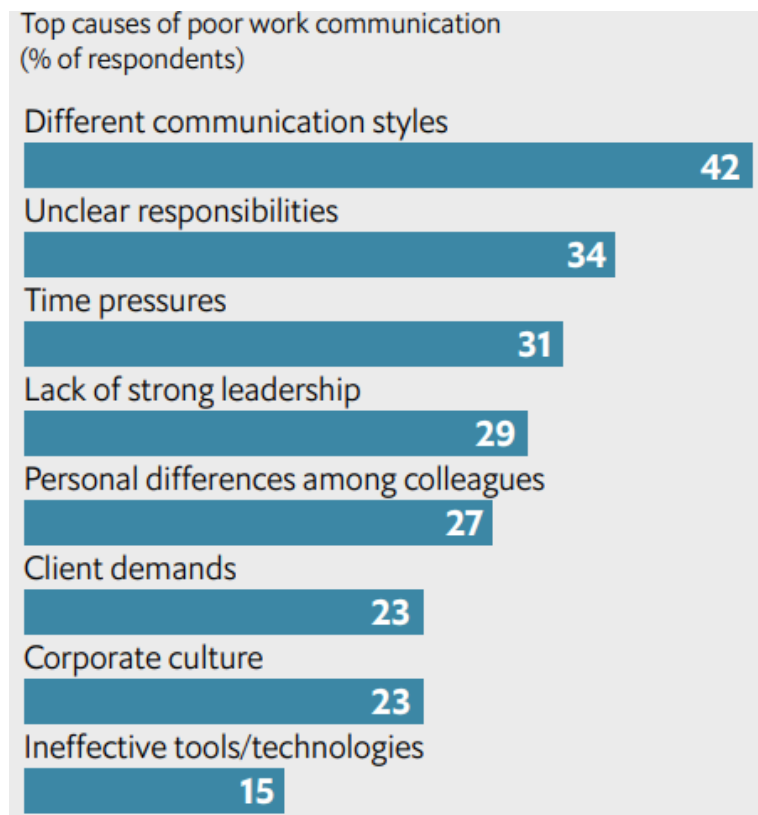
### Faster way to become managers
